ECH SPRING MEETING, BERGAMO, 25-27 April Future-proofing homeopathy

With the ever-increasing costs of venue hire, accommodation and travel, members agreed with Council's proposal that there should be only one face-to-meeting in 2024 – in the Spring – with an online meeting organised for November.

Full details will follow shortly but we are delighted to announce that top researcher Professor Paolo Bellavite, of the University of Verona, has very kindly agreed to address the meeting. He is the author of over 250 published scientific papers and a particular area of interest has been the possible scientific bases for complementary medicines, including homeopathy.

Health Minister has proposed a ban on using public medical insurance to fund homeopathy and other services with no proven benefit. Homeopathy makes no sense as a health insurance benefit, wrote Health Minister Karl Lauterbach on X, formerly Twitter. The foundation of our policies must be scientific evidence.

DZVhÄ President, Dr Michaela Geiger, has been spearheading the campaign to protest against this ill-judged proposal. We are grateful to her for taking time out of her busy schedule to summarise the situation here.

With his press release in January 2024, the German Minister of Health unleashed a media and political storm. In just a few days, I had to deal with 80 interview requests on behalf of the German Central Association of Homeopathic Doctors (DZVhÄ). Our German press agency (DPA) article reached 140 newspapers throughout Germany. My radio interview, also posted on social media, reached even more –

Many colleagues supported us with articles and letters to regional editors. Our Health Ministry has to date received mail from 8,000 outraged citizens.

What is the situation? It's about the cuts in statutory benefits for homeopathic and anthroposophical medicines, as well as medical services in homeopathy. Two thirds of German health insurance funds offer these statutory benefits. If our Health Minister had chosen the easy way, he would simply have to call on citizens to change their health insurance fund because one third do not offer these voluntary statutory benefits and, since they are voluntary services, this is not a burden on the community's purse. Reimbursement of homeopathic medicines in statutory benefits applies to children under the age of 12. As far as the alleged cost savings of statutory benefits for homeopathic medicines and medical services are concerned, they are truly homeopathic!

The draft bill is now available and will be submitted to Parliament at the end of April 2024. It is a small section of the Healthcare Reinforcement Act, an omnibus draft bill, i.e. part of a large draft bill containing many different proposals. We are now tackling the challenge in various ways:

1. With a parliamentary petition. Why a parliamentary petition? To obtain the right to be heard in Parliament.

3. With a great deal of background political work: we are supported in the scientific discourse by the Scientific Society (WissHom) and the International Federation of Anthroposophic Medical Associations (IVAA). We also have an excellent network of doctors' associations, patient associations and scientists, with whom we collaborate closely and regularly. In our European community, it is now very important to support our ECH Council in a coordinated manner by addressing MEPs from the Health, Social Affairs and Economy portfolios, together with the other medical societies in complementary medicine.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all very much for your great support!

HEALTH SCIENCE LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

Digitisation allows easier access

Germany has a long tradition of health libraries. From their origin in monasteries, they became centres of knowledge and education. In modern times, this tradition has been continued by the Central Library of Medicine. In addition, as a specialty in Germany, special collection areas and special libraries that focus on one topic were established. Those services were transformed to specialised information services and portals as part of the digital transformation process. One such project is OPEN-CAM, which provides literature on integrative medicine in a specialist library and hosts the literature database CAMbase. Based on this example, the article shows how digital transformation has influenced the library landscape and its structures in Germany.
